
The 51 US Supreme Court Justices from 1925 to 2019; Their Terms; Votes on the ACLU's Cases; Related Information

The chart below shows how many ACLU / SCOTUS cases the 51 Supreme Court justices voted on and related information. The justices are listed in the percentage of cases they voted on the same side as the ACLU, the highest percentage first.

For example, Justice Arthur Joseph Goldberg, who had the highest percentage of votes on the side of the ACLU, voted on the side of the ACLU 34 times out of his 35 votes or 97.14% on the side of the ACLU. Columns E and G show he was nominated for the Court by Democratic President John F. Kennedy.

The chart also shows that 29 or 56.86% of the 51 justices were nominated by Republican presidents while 22 or 43.14% were nominated by Democratic presidents.
